The meeting was conducted through a whatsapp. Ld District and Sessions Judge examined the current situation in Jail number 11 and 12. It was resolved that Jail Superintendent with the aid of DLSA counsels shall endeavour to move maximum bail applications for the inmates, as per the guidelines of the Delhi High Court and the High Powered Committee. It was further resolved that the data be shared with the Central Office, DSLSA. It was resolved that apart from the applications for interim bail, applications shall also be moved for bails on merits, through the DLSA advocates posted in jails. The committee thanked the Jail Staff and DLSA for making sincere efforts, which caused the reduction in jail population even below the sanctioned strength.

The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the chair.
